## 1. THE YEAR IN RETROSPECT

The Institute maintained its steady progress in its activities and programmes in the context of its basic objectives. As I had reported in the preceding year, we had constituted three faculty working groups to pursue focused research and training activities in international management, specific industry studies, and management of strategic priority sectors. These working groups have made some progress in their respective areas although we have not been able to achieve expected results mainly because of constraint of faculty resources. Our new Centre for Educational Innovation has also continued research and development work in social entrepreneurship, experiments in education with special reference to underprivileged groups, and programmes for empowerment of women.


#### Abstract

In the Post-Graduate Programme, our effort to help weaker students to cope with the demands and pressures of the programme with the help of a participative tutorial system has continued with satisfactory results. We have also continued to collaborate with some French management schools by accepting their students for a small part in our Post-Graduate Programme with the facility of transferring their credits to their parent institutions. This collaboration has been found very useful from the point of view of the French institutions and their students. Our doctoral and faculty development programmes have also continued with satisfactory results. We offered a new programme for university teachers in management of small enterprises during the year under review.

The Institute organized a workshop on management of development, change, and innovations with the aim of sensitizing students to opportunities for work and career development in areas of social and economic development of rural and underprivileged sections of society. This workshop also provided an opportunity to faculty to identify the ways in which the Institute can strengthen its educational effort with reference to underprivileged groups. Our Alumni Seminar Reunion in celebration of the 25 th Convocation of the Institute elicited encouraging response from the initial batches of our graduates who provided us valuable feedback and advice on the programme. We hope to continue and expand this programme of involvement of our alumni in the process of review of our activities and programmes.


As in previous years, management development programmes for executives cover a broad spectrum of public and private sector enterprise, government and public service organizations, and voluntary organizations. Qur programmes in priority sectors such as agriculture, rural development, health and population, transport, and energy have yielded satisfactory results in terms of participation and feedback on their usefulness. We conducted during 1989-90 a programme for chief executives of public enterprises in Commonwealth countries with the support and sponsorship of the Commonwealth Secretariat, which also sponsored a training programme in economic management and planning in developing economies. This programme was organized jointly by the Institute and the University of Glasgow. We hope to continue in future years this relevant and useful effort in management development at the international level. The Institute also participated in an exchange programme between Indian and European management schools under a scheme sponsored by the Government of India and the European Economic Community. This programme will help us in our activities relating to international management in view of the rapid globalization of bușiness and industry.

The research and consultancy activities of the Institute faculty covered a large variety of organizations in public and private sectors as well as government and non-govemment agencies in all important areas of economic development. The Institute faculty and research staff published 12 books and 11 monographs during the year, apart from a large number of articles, conference papers, and working papers. We could also make significant additions to our computing and related facilities for research and training purposes. We hope to continue expansion of these facilities in view of the constantly growing demands for such modern tools of management education and research. The expansion of our physical facilities is also in progress.

I am happy to report that Professor Girja Sharan was honoured during the year with a commendation medal in the area of education by the Indian Institute of Agricultural Engineers. Mr. K.R. Pichholiya won the first prize awarded by the India Chapter of the Poverty Eradication Foundation. Unfortunately, the

Institute lost one of its senior members of the faculty, Professor Tirath Gupta, who died in an air crash.
I take this opportunity to express our gratitude to the large number of organizations and people in India and abroad whose help and cooperation as our friends and users of our services are most valuable to us for the Institute's health and progress. We also owe deep appreciation and gratitude to the Government of India, the Chairman and Members of our Board of Governors, and the IIMA Society for their constant support and advice in conducting our activities and programmes. Finally, I gratefully acknowledge my appreciation for the Institute's faculty, staff, and students for their contribution to the task of maintaining the Institute's strength and character.

## Endowed Chairs

Professors V.R. Gaikwad and Pradip N. Khandwalla respectively continued as State Bank of India Professor of Rural Development and Larsen \& Toubro Professor of Organizational Behaviour, and Professor Dwijendra Tripathi held the Kasturbhai Lalbhai Fellowship during the year.

Professor Nitin R. Patel was appointed to the CMC Chair in Management from March 1, 1990.

## 3. POST-GRADUATE PROGRAMME IN MANAGEMENT

The twenty-sixth session of the Post-Graduate Programme in Management started on June 29, 1989, 'with an enrolment of 200 students, including 13 students who were asked to repeat the first year of the Programme. Seven students discontinued their studies during the year for various reasons. One student has been permitted to rejoin the First Year Programme during the academic year 1990-91 on medical grounds.

The first year student strength at the end of the year was 193; this includes 35 SC/ST students and 8 repeaters. Twenty-seven students will specialize in Agricultural Management (including 2 repeaters) during the second year of their studies.

The second year programme commenced on June 28, 1989, with an enrolment of 192 students. Summer placement presentations were organized for two days in which students in groups presented their summer project experience. Out of 6 students who were given conditional promotion to the second year, 4 have fulfilled the academic requirements during the academic year 1989-90.

Two students failed to fulfil the academic requirements for graduation from the Institute. Two students were granted leave of absence from classes, one for the second term and another for the third term, on medical grounds. These students would complete their course requirements during the academic year 1990-91.

At the end of the second year, 188 students had satisfactorily completed the academic requirements for graduation from the Institute. Twenty-one students belonged to SC/ST and 23 students specialized in Agricultural Management. This includes one student who was granted one year's leave of absence from the programme at the end of the first term in the academic year 1988-89.

## Preparatory Programme

Fifty-seven students, who were identified to be deficient in basic mathematics on the basis of their background, performance in the admission test, and interviews, were called to attend the Preparatory Programme in Mathematics which was held from June 12 to 25,1989 . Forty-nine students attended the programme.

## Orientation Programme

The highlights of the orientation programme included a session on introduction to management and managerial functions to explain what professional management is all about, what managers do, functions of management, etc.; a panel discussion by faculty representatives from all areas/centres/groups on the compulsory package and introduction to areas; and orientation by senior students. For the first time, PGP alumni were invited to talk with the students their experiences, which was well taken.

## Tutorials to Assist Weaker Students

Additional efforts were put in by instructors in specific courses throughout the first year by conducting extra tutorial classes to help assist the weaker students to cope with the programme. In addition, senior students identified for the purpose were entrusted with the responsibility of conducting systematic weekend tutorial classes to selected students, particularly SC/ST students, to help improve their performance. This had considerable impact on the students' academic work in the second and third terms.

## Curriculum

As recommended by the PGP Review Committee, 6 class sessions, 2 in each term in the first year of the programme, were devoted to create awareness among students on the social and environmental factors under the Indian Social and Political Environment course. Eminent persons from different fields were
invited to give lectures. This was well received and appreciated by the students.
The first year students studied 24 courses in different functional areas throughout the year.
The second year students (General) were required to credit a minimum of 17 and a maximum of 20 full credit courses.

During the year, 39 elective courses were offered in addition to the two compulsory courses. One course was repeated in a subsequent term on account of high registration. On account of heavy registration, 12 elective courses were taught in two sections. Moreover 60 ohe term project courses were offered to 112 students in areas of their interest.

In the second year programme (Specialization in Agriculture), in addition to the two compulsory courses, 18 elective courses and 19 project courses were offered.

## Admission of Foreign Students

Under the students' exchange programme, 4 students from ESCAP Graduate School of Management and 3 from ESSEC Graduate School of Management, Paris, took courses in the second year of the programme. Three students spent two terms at the Institute while 4 students spent one term. Credits obtained by these students at the Institute were transmitted to their respective institutions.

## Graduation

One hundred and eighty-one students, including 22 students specializing in Agricultural Management, were awarded the Post-Graduate Diploma in Management at the twenty-fifth Convocation held on March 24, 1990. Mr Russi Mody, Chairman and Managing Director, TISCO, delivered the Convocation address.

## Scholarships

Industry Scholarships
Thirty-one industry scholarships (29 merit based and 2 means based) were awarded as follows:

## General Industry Scholarships

Fourteen students from the first year (1988-90 batch) were awarded scholarships of Rs.3,500 each for the academic year 1988-89. Fifteen second year students (1988-90 batch) were awarded scholarships of Rs.3,500 to Rs.3,600 each for the academic year 1988-89.

## Bank of Maharashtra Scholarships

Two scholarships of Rs.3,500 each for poor SC/ST students were awarded, one to a first year student and one to a second year student, for the academic year 1989-90.

## Faculty Memorial Scholarships

One first year student of the 1988-90 batch was awarded Professor Warren W. Haynes Memorial Scholarship of Rs 3,000 and one second year student of the 1988-90 batch was awarded Professor B.K. Hegde Memorial Scholarship also of Rs.3,000.

## PGP Students 1987 Batch Scholarships

The PGP Batch 1987 Scholarship was awarded to a first year student (1988-90 batch) and the IIMA Silver Jubilee Scholarship to a second year student (1988-90 batch). Both scholarships carried a value of Rs.3,000 each.

## Government of India Merit-cum-Means Scholarships

Eleven students from the first year (1988-90 batch) and 10 students from the second year (1988-90 batch) were awarded the Government of India Merit-cum-Means scholarships of Rs.2,200 each.

## IIMA SC/ST Scholarships

During 1989-90, all the 38 students in the first year and 22 students in the second year were granted IIMA SC/ST scholarships of Rs.1,500 each. In addition, 8 students from the first year and two students from the second year were granted waiver of tuition fee and room rent amounting to Rs.1,430 each.

## Loan Assistance

One student in the first year (1988-90 batch) was granted a loan of Rs.4,000 to finance his studies.

## PLACEMENT

## Pre-Placement Talks

The 1990 placement season started with the first pre-placement talk by HCL Limited on December 16, 1989. Sixty organizations, ( 10 public sector, 42 private sector, and 8 multinationals) gave pre-placement talks during weekends till February 22, 1990.

The graduating class consisted of 188 students ( 165 General and 23 SPA). Two of the graduating students were foreign citizens and were not eligible for placement. Twenty students-19 General and 1 SPA--did not need placement and nine students--all General--sought deferment by a year. Out of 10 students who sought deferment last year, seven students--one PGP IV-returned for placement in 1990. Deferment was granted to students whose career plans matched with institutional objectives. Students sought deferment to try out entrepreneurial activities, work with voluntary organizations, or take the IAS examination. Therefore, 164 students ( 142 General and 22 SPA) sought placement facility this year Except one student who was placed in April 5, the rest of the class was placed before March 21, 1990.

In all, 157 organizations announced 987 jobs. On-campus interviews were held from March 1 to 13 and off-campus interviews for two students in the last week of March.

Sixty-four organizations conducted interviews; 14 public sector organizations, 40 private sector organizations, and 10 multinational organizations made 251 offers.

## Summer Assignments

For summer training, 197 students of the first year (including 9 FPMs) were assigned to 66 organizations.

## Computerization of Placement Activities

Placement data for 1989-90 have been computerized, leading to cutting down of additional manpower required during the peak placement season. Further, information became available expeditiously regarding students, companies, and acceptances and rejections of offers.

## 4. FELLOW PROGRAMME IN MANAGEMENT

So far 99 students have completed the requirements of the Fellow Programme and awarded the title of "Fellow of Indian Institute of Management, Ahmedabad." Another 40 students are currently at various stages of the programme.

## Admission

During the year, 742 candidates applied for admission, an increase of 30 per cent over the last year. One hundred and nine candidates were called for interview. Admission was offered to 22 candidates for the programme commencing July 1990.

## Placement

Out of 5 students who have been awarded the title of "Fellow of IIMA" during 1990, 3 have joined academic institutions and 2 have joined industry.

## Review of the Fellow Programme

The FPM Programme was reviewed in totality during 1988-89 and some of the following recommendations were implemented:

## Promotion of the Programme

The FPM advertisments, bulletins, and posters have been recast in attractive formats, highlighting the programme's distinguished features. This helped in attracting more number of applications.

## Academic Packages

The first year Research Methodology course was reviewed and redesigned. A sub-committee of the FPM Executive was appointed to review the second year Research Methodology course Courses in Economics and Quantitative Methods were offered to FPM students with a different focus.

## New Courses

Two new compulsory courses, Philosophical Foundations of Management and Self and Career Development, were introduced.

Agriculture Management
Agriculture Management has been included as one of the areas of specialization in the Fellow Programme during this year. Three students were admitted in this area.

Assisting Faculty
After completing their comprehensive examinations, students are required to work as research assistants with faculty members of their choice.

## Thesis Publication

Several publishers were contacted for publishing FPM theses. Sage has agreed to bring out a series of books based on them. To begin with, five theses have been identified for further processing.

## FPM Bulletin

The FPM students, under the supervision of the FPM Executive Committee, have for the first time brought out a research bulletin.

The first issue of the FPM Bulletintitled Cipher-M was released during March 1990 by Mr. V. Krishnamurthy, Chairman of the Board of Governors, IIMA. The release function was attended by the FPM students, the FPM Executive Members, and other faculty.

## 5. FACULTY DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

The Faculty Development Centre (FDC) offered the eleventh Faculty Development Programme in Management (FDP) from June 28, 1989, to February 28, 1990. Ten participants from nine educational and professional institutions in India participated.

An FDP alumni seminar was held on March 24, 1990, as part of the IIMA Alumni Seminar Reunion on March 23 and 24, 1990. The theme of the seminar was "Management Education in India: Constraints and Prospects" which attracted twenty alumni from 12 educational and professional institutions. Eight papers were received on various facets of management education. The seminar was well received by all those who attended.

A programme on "Small Enterprise Management for University Teachers" was offered from April 9 to 27, 1990. The programme had 10 participants from educational institutions in India. Professor K. Ramachandran coordinated the programme.

FDC has mailed brochures for the 12th FDP beginning June 28, 1990, to more than 400 institutions in India and abroad.

## 6. RESEARCH AND PUBLICATIONS

At the end of the academic year 1988-89, eight research projects, 23 seed money projects, and 10 case development projects were in progress. During the academic year 1989-90, one research project, 13 seed money projects, and 7 case development projects were initiated. The remaining seven research projects, 28 seed money projects, and 10 case development projects were in progress.

## Publications

Vikalpa, a quarterly journal published by the Institute, has completed the thirteenth year of publication. The journal includes original and stimulating articles based on managerial and organizational research and consulting experience.

The faculty and staff published 12 books and 11 monographs and wrote 79 articles or chapters in books in India and abroad. They also presented 62 papers and gave 24 lectures in various seminars and conferences. In addition 65 working papers were brought out.

## 7. MANAGEMENT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES

Twenty-eight management development programmes (MDPs) and four Workshops were conducted during this academic year. The Institute offered eight new programmes.

Participation from government and public sector organizations continued to increase. Six hundred and eight professionals from 460 public sector organizations and 493 professionals from 378 private organizations participated in the MDPs during the year.

## New Programmes

The Commonwealth Top Management Programme for Public Enterprises was organized in collaboration with the Commonwealth Secretariat, London, from August 6 to September 12, 1989. This programme was a sequel to the three Roundtables on Public Enterprises Management organized by the Management Development Programmes of the Commonwealth Secretariat in Cyprus, India, and Malaysia. IIMA had collaborated in organizing the India Roundtable earlier.

The programme was meant for persons belonging to top management of public enterprises in Commonwealth countries. Thirty-three professionals from 19 countries participated. Field visits were arranged in India and Malaysia.

The Training Programme on Economic Management and Planning in Developing Economics (jointly conducted by IIMA and the Centre for Development Studies, University of Glasgow, Glasgow, in collaboration with the Commonwealth Secretariat, London) was held from November 20 to December 19;1989. The programme was meant for officials of Ministries/Departments of Planning, Economics, and Food and Agriculture at secretary/assistant secretary level of developing countries. Twenty-four officials from eighteen developing countries participated in the programme.

A programme on Computer Aided Management in Road Transport Undertakings was held from December 25 to 30, 1989. Twenty-eight participants attended the programwe.

## General Management Programmes

The 3-Tier Programme for Management Development-the oldest and largest of the Institute's pro-grammes--was offered for the twenty-seventh time. In this programme, executives from three different levels--middle, senior, and top--participated in exploring and understanding management problems. The Top Management segment (Tier III) was offered on the theme of "Managing for Results: Choices and Strategies." In all, 236 participants attended the three programmes.

The Institute offered the twentieth Small and Medium Enterprises Programme which focused on concepts and skills needed for improving productivity and efficiency of small and medium enterprises. Thirty-seven executives attended the programme.

The Institute offered the fourteenth Advanced Management Programme for Public Enterprises under the auspices of the Bureau of Public Enterprises, Government of India. Twenty-five senior managers from public sector enterprises participated in the programme. Participants visited USSR on a study tour.

## Functional Programmes

Programmes on Logistics and Physical Distribution Management, Financial Services, Management Control Systems, Strategies for Competitive Advantage, Micro Computers in Materiais Management, Project Management, Advanced Data Analysis for Marketing Decisions, Compuier Aided Financial Decision Making, Computer Based Information Systems, Advanced Programme on Human Resources Managemert, and Agricultural and Rural Development Programmes were offered during the year.

## Public Systems Programmes

A Regional Workshop on Population Programme Management for Asia and the Middle East sponsored by the International Committee on the Management of Population Programmes (ICOMP) was offered and 33 officials from 17 countries participated.

A programme on Computer Aided Management in Road Transport Undertakings for middle level functional heads and EDP managers of road transport undertakings was held from December 25 to 30, 1989. Twenty-eight participants attended the programme.

In addition the Institute offered several training programmes for IAS officers sponsored by the Government of India. They included Policy Planning and Analysis, Industrial Policy Planning and Development (twice), Project Management: Level II, Management Control Systems, Project Management: Level I, and Management Concepts and Decision Making Techniques.

## Long Duration Programme

The Institute offered the fourteenth Management Education Programme from December 10, 1989 to April 21, 1990. Thirty-eight participants attended this programme. It provides an intensive post-entry exposure in all areas of management to executives with functional experience who, according to sponsoring organizations, have potential to move to general management positions.

## Workshops/Seminars

The following workshops/seminars were offered during the year: Stress Audit in Organizations, Expert Systems for Management, Effective Turnaround of Sick Units, Computer Applications in Railways: A Managerial Perspective, Agricultural Input Marketing, Social Forestry, Top Level Management on Rainfed Research, and Management Alumni on Management of Development, Change, and Innovations.

## New Programmes/Seminars/Workshops 1990-91

Programmes on Managing Human Resources in Public Organizations, International Programme for Senior HRM Executives, Designing and Implementing Performance Appraisal Systems for HRD, and Agricultural Input Marketing will be offered.

Seminars on MIS, Top Management Workshop on Institution Building and HRD Strategies for Strategic Organizations, Flexible Manufacturing Systems, Sustainable Development of High Risk Environment, Management of Agro Processing Enterprises, Issues on Cooperative Development, Performance of Fish Farmers Development Agency for Fresh Water Aquaculture, and European Economic Community and India are planned to be offered in the next academic year.

## Core Group on Soclal Forestry

The Core Group faculty visited Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, and Goa to identify data needs and carry out survey work to prepare working models.

## 10. CENTRE FOR REGIONAL MANAGEMENT STUDIES

## 14. FACILITIES

## Vikram Sarabhai Library

During the year, 3000 books were added to the library, bringing the total number of books to $1,20,530$, The library subscribes to 593 periodicals. The library's collection of annual reports of most big Indian companies and a few selected foreign companies is fairly up-to-date.

A library automation programme was initiated during the year. In the first phase, circulation processes and records have been automated through a PC/XT computer.

During the year, extension to the Kasturbhai Lalbhai Management Development Centre was completed. The work consisted of the following facilities:

Centrally air-conditioned theatre type, tiered mini auditorium (capacity 80 seats), four small seminar rooms (for about 8 to 10 participants), two halls, and office block for MDP Chairman/Coordinator and administrative staff.

A revised plan for the new complex consisting of the Ravi Matthai Centre for Educational Innovation(CEI), Computer Centre, and office block has been finalized by the Building Committee. The salient features of this ' C ' shaped complex are as under:

## Ravi Matthai Centre

This is an octagonal shaped building located opposite the main complex and consists of an auditorium with 550 seats with a partly flat floored multipurpose hall and partly tiered seating arrangements. It also has a small hall for conducting seminars.

## Computer Centre

This is a building located opposite the service tower for housing the computer centre.

## Office Block

This is a building interconnecting the Ravi Matthai Centre and the Computer Centre and located parallel to the existing cycle/scooter parking. At present, two stories will be constructed.

Construction work of the Ravi Matthai Centre up to plinth has begun.
